10 Key Facts

The children are beginning to work on some of Year I's 10 basic skills in maths. You can help your child practice these skills at home. We are currently working on

- Counting forwards from any number between 0-100
- Counting backwards from any number between 0-100
- Counting in multiples of 2,5,10's
- Identifying one more and one less of a given number within 100

In maths sessions this half term we will be covering the following areas of maths

- Addition within 20, crossing over the 10.
- 2D and 3D shapes including some of their properties
- Subtraction within 20, crossing over the 10.

Reading continues to be a huge focus around school and within Year I. Please ensure that your child brings their reading book to school every day, so that we can listen to them read.

Hearing your child read at home is extremely important. Can you also try and listen to your child read at least three times a week. This will really help your child with their fluency, pace and confidence. Remember asking questions will check whether they understand what they are reading. Daily reading makes a huge difference to progress!
