## Which Boston is best?

This half term our curriculum focus is Geography. Our enquiry question is what is the significance of Boston Massachusetts? We are going to link back to our learning in History last half term on the Pilgrim Fathers to help us. We are going to be using Map skills to locate places, plan routes, examine physical and human features and land use and much more!

**P.E. will be on Wednesdays and Fridays** this half term. Please make sure your child has plain blue/black shorts, white/red t-shirt and trainers or plimsolls. No jewellery is permitted for PE.

## Maths

### Fractions

Recognise/find/name/write fractions  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{2}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{8}$  of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity

Write simple fractions e.g.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$ .

### Measurement

Choose/use appropriate standard units to estimate/measure length/height (m/cm); mass (kg/g); temp ( $^{\circ}\text{C}$ ); cap (litres/ml) to nearest unit, using rulers, scales, thermometers and measuring vessels.

Compare and order lengths, mass, volume/capacity and record the results using  $>$ ,  $<$  and  $=$  as well as simple multiples

### Multiplication and division

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers.

Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication ( $\times$ ), division ( $\div$ ) and equals ( $=$ ) signs

Show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot

## Literacy

This term our writing focus text is the *Lonely Beast*

- Postcards
- Descriptive writing
- Newspaper Article

**Reading** continues to be a huge focus around school and within Year 2. Please ensure that your child brings their reading book to school every day, so we can swap their books regularly.

Hearing your child read at home is extremely important. Can you also try and listen to your child **read at least three times** a week. This will really help your child with their fluency, pace and confidence. Remember asking lots of questions will check whether they understand what they are reading. Daily reading makes a huge difference to progress!
