Autumn Term 2020

Topic-Rivers

As geographers we will learn about all about rivers. We will be identifying the features of rivers. We will look at and discuss the important uses of water and how we can help to prevent pollution. We will find out about different rivers in the world as well as learning about the Humber Estuary. We will use research skills on the internet as well as maps and atlases.



Maths

This term in maths we will focus on:

Ensuring we know 2, 5 and 10 multiplication and division facts.

Using known facts to derive other facts such as those which are 10 times bigger or by using the inverse.

Place Value

- Counting in multiples of 3, 4, 50 and 100
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones).
- Finding 10 or 100 more or less than a given number.
- Comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000.

Addition and Subtraction

- Adding and subtracting numbers mentally, including: a 3-digit no and 1s, 10s, 100s.
- PE this term will take place outside. Please send children to school in their PE kit on a Tuesday. PE kit should be black shorts, joggers or leggings, a red or white t-shirt, trainers and children should wear their red school jumper or cardigan.
- We ask that children practice their **times tables** regularly at home. The children need to be fluent with their 2, 5, 10, 3, 4 and 8 times tables by the end of year 3 and know the division facts related to these.
- Children will bring home a reading book. Reading is really important so please try and listen to your child read at least three times a week, this does not have to be a whole book, just 5 minutes or a few pages each time.
- Spellings will come home on a Friday to be practiced for the week. These do not need to come back to school.
- Please regularly check the website and twitter for up-to-date letters and information.

Literacy

We will be looking at the book, 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner.

This terms writing focus will be to:

- Use a range of coordinating conjunctions (for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so)
- Begin to know what a fronted adverbial is and experiment with using these (How? Slowly,... Where? Through the forest,... When? Everyday,....)
- write a range of texts, such as, descriptions, diary entries and nonchronological reports.

This terms spellings focus will be

- continuing to learn common exception words
- Suffixes (s, es, er, ed, ing)
- Prefixes (dis, un, mis, re)
- Apostrophes for contractions

This terms reading focus will be

- Develop positive attitudes to reading by listening to and discussing a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry.
- Drawing inferences about characters
- Identifying different structures within texts to begin to understand the differences in genres.
- Asking questions to further understanding
