Spring Term 2021

Topic:

The Bronze Age and Iron Age

As historians we continue to head back to prehistoric times. We will continue to look at ancient artefacts, objects and monuments to see what they reveal about ancient times. We will learn how people of Britain developed over thousands of years, this term focussing on The Bronze Age and the Iron Age. We will make comparisons across these 3 key time periods.

- **PE this term will take place outside. Please send children to school in their PE kit on a Monday and Friday. PE kit should be black shorts, joggers or leggings, a red or white t-shirt, trainers and children should wear their red school jumper or cardigan.**
- We ask that children practice their **times tables** regularly at home. The children need to be fluent with their 2, 5, 10, 3, 4 and 8 times tables by the end of year 3 and know the division facts related to these.
- Children will bring home a reading book. Reading is really important so please try and listen to your child **read at least three times** a week, this does not have to be a whole book, just 5 minutes or a few pages each time.
- **Spellings** will come home on a Monday to be practiced for the week. These do not need to come back to school.
- Please regularly check the **website** and **twitter** for up-to-date letters and information.

Maths

Literacy

We will be looking at the book, 'Wild Girl' by Chris Wormell

This terms **writing** focus will be to:

- continue to use a range of conjunctions (because, but, although, therefore, so) and fronted adverbials (Slowly,... Through the forest,... Everyday,...)
- write a range of texts, such as informative leaflets, discussion texts and an adventure story.

This terms **spellings** focus will be:

- continuing to learn common exception words
- Prefixes (sub and tele)
- Suffixes (ness, full, less, ly)
- Words which have a /sh/ sound but spelt with different letters (such as chef)
- Contractions

This terms **reading** focus will be:

- Understanding the meaning of words in different contexts.
- Making inferences and using the text or images to support inferences.
