Spring Term 1 2022

## Topic- Anglo Saxons and Vikings.

As historians, we will be travelling back to AD 410 where the Roman Empire is crumbling, and we saw the rise of the Anglo-Saxon invaders and their impact on Britain. We then move forward to AD 793 where we see the first invaders from Denmark, Sweden, and Norway - known as the Vikings. We will investigate both eras in history.



In Art nearer the end of the term we will be looking at the Bayeux Tapestry.

## Maths

Our maths focus for this term will be ...

- Multiply and divide by 0, 1, 3, 6, 9
- Multiply and divide by 7, 11, 12

Time

- Telling the time to the nearest minute/ 5 minutes
- 24-hour clock
- Finding durations
- Comparing durations

Multiplication and division

- Multiplication and division facts 12x 12
- Recognising factor pairs.
- Efficient Multiplication
- Multiply and dividing written methods
- Measurement area and perimeter

Fractions

- Fraction Equivalents
- Count in fractions.
- Add and subtract fractions.
- Decimals- Tenths and hundredths
- Divide by 10 and 100 using decimals.

**We will sit the new statutory times table test in June 2021.**

It is an expectation, by the end of Year 4, for children to know their times tables up to 12 x 12. Please encourage your child to practise, practise, practise!

## Literacy

We will be looking at the book, Arthur and the golden Rope.

This term our **writing** focus will be to...

- Create our own poetry, diary entries, character descriptions, discussions, narrative story writing, persuasive adverts, and newspaper articles.
- Varying our sentence structures using a range of conjunctions to enhance the complexity.
- We will be beginning to write as a reader and ensure we are meeting the needs of the reader by including all the features and information they need.
- Checking for sense and for clarity so we are taking pride in our work and being the best writers, we can be.

This term's spellings focus will be:

- Common exception words for Year 3 /4
- Words beginning 'gu'
- Adding suffix 'ture'
- Possessive apostrophe with plurals

This term's reading focus will be:

- Using 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' as the driver for our whole class reading.
- Developing our vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval, and summarizing skills as part of whole class reading.
- Developing our choral read skills and increasing in fluency and speed of reading.

- We ask that children regularly practise and learn their **times tables**. It has been proven to make a massive difference to the speed and accuracy of their calculation skills.
- Reading is important so please try and listen to your child **read at least three times** a week, this does not have to be a whole book, just 5 minutes or a few pages each time.
- PE will be on Wednesdays and Fridays. Please come in your P.E kit.
