## Year 4 Spring Term 2020

## Topic - Traders & Invaders

As historians, we will be travelling back to AD 410 where the Roman Empire is crumbling and we saw the rise of the Anglo-Saxon invaders and their impact on Britain. We then move forward to AD 793 where we see the first invaders from Denmark, Sweden and Norway -known as the Vikings. We will investigate both eras in history.

As artists and designers will be focussing on replicating Anglo-Saxon and Viking artifacts for a trade fair.

As **geographers**, we will be indientifying the locations of where the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings settled and where places still exist today.

As **musicians**, we will be building on our Boudicca raps from last term and adapt it to our invasion work.

As **scientists**, we will be investigating sound and how sound is made; how sound travels and investigate pitch and volume of sound.

## Maths

We will be looking at 3 different aspects of how we teach and learn maths. These are:

Fluency: The ability to know key mathematical facts and recall these efficiently.

Reasoning: The use of logical thinking to make sense of a problem.

Problem Solving: Seeking and exploring solutions, exploring patterns and articulating our thinking.

This term in maths we will focus on:

Coordinates and Translation - describing position on a single quadrant; translating shapes across the quadrant.

Shape - 2D and 3D shape; sorting and classifying triangles.

Measures - multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and applying this knowledge to converting measures; area and perimeter of shapes.

We will sit the new statutory times table test in June 2020.

We will be focussing on 6, 7, 8 and 9 times tables. Please use https://www.themathsfactor.com/times-tablescheck/2gclid=EAIaIQobChMI2POWkca65QIVWODtCh3eKg8XE AAYASABEqK6ZvD\_BwE#/levels

It is an expectation, by the end of Year 4, for children to know their times tables up to  $12 \times 12$ . Please encourage your child to practise, pracise and then more practise!

- We ask that children practice their times tables regularly at home, the children should know which
  ones they are focussing on. Please encourage your child to use The Maths Factor or Times Tables
  Rock Stars to develop their recall of times tables.
- Reading is really important so please try and listen to your child **read at least three times** a week, this does not have to be a whole book, just 5 minutes or a few pages each time.
- PE will be on Monday and Tuesday. Your child will need their PE kits for both days.

## Literacy

We will be beginning the term looking at the book, Arthur and the Golden Rope.

This term's writing focus will be to:

- Varying our sentence structures using a range of conjunctions to enhance the complexity.
- We will beginning to write as a reader and ensure we are meeting the needs of the reader by including all the features and information they need.
- Checking for sense and for clarity so we are taking pride in our work and being the best writers we can be.
- Poetry, diary entries, discussion, fact files, setting descriptions, myths, writing in role and narrative descriptions.

This term's spellings focus will be:

- Common exception words for Year 3 /4
- Words beginning 'gu'
- Adding suffix 'ture'
- Possessive apostrophe with plurals

This term's **reading** focus will be:

- Using 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' as the driver for our whole class reading.
- Developing our vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summarising skills as part of whole class reading.
- Developing our choral read skills and increasing in fluency and speed of reading.

Year 4 are taking part in the 10,000 page challenge. As a class, our aim is to read 10,000 pages by the end of the academic year. When your child reads at home, take a note of how many pages have been read and this will be recorded the next day. At the end of the week, we will add all the pages up and have an on going total.
