Maths

Our maths focus for this term will be ...

Multiplication and Division

- Multiply and divide whole numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.
- Use formal methods for multiplication and division

Fractions

- Compare and order fractions
- Identify, name and write equivalent fractions
- Convert improper fractions to mixed numbers
- Add and subtract fractions

Perimeter and Area

- Measure and calculate the perimeter
- Calculate and compare the area

Literacy

We will be looking at a range of Greek Myths and Legends.

This term our writing focus will be to ...

- Identify the audience and purpose of their writing.
- Select the appropriate form and use other similar writing as models for their own.
- Ensure the consistent and correct use of tense throughout their piece of writing.
- Select appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning.
- Use adverbs, preposition phrases and expanded noun phrases effectively to add detail, qualification and precision.

This terms spellings focus will be

- Continuing to learn common exception words
- Rare GPCs (bruise, guarantee, yacht)
- Words ending in -ably, -ibly.
- Homophones (led/lead, steel/steal)

This terms **reading** focus will be

- Apply their knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes, (morphology and etymology) both to read aloud and to understand the meaning of new words that they meet.
- Continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, nonfiction, poetry, plays and reference books.
- Make comparisons within and across books.

- We ask that children regularly practise and learn their **times tables**. It has been proven to make a massive difference to the speed and accuracy of their calculation skills.
- It is still important for children in Year 5 to be heard read. This way, the meaning of
 unfamiliar words can be discussed and vocabulary extended. Questions posed, arising from
 the text, is also an excellent way to develop children's understanding of what they have read.
 3 times a week is ideal.
