- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as; 7 = ?-9

• Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.

• Use simple punctuation and correct letter formation.

Instructions, Fact Files, Character Descriptions, Story Writing, Recounts, Postcards and Posters.

Reading continues to be a huge focus around school and within Year 1. Please ensure that your child brings their reading book to school every day, so we can swap their books regularly.

Hearing your child read at home is extremely important. Can you also try and listen to your child **read at least three times** a week. This will really help your child with their fluency, pace and confidence. Remember asking lots of questions will check whether they understand what they are reading.
