Maths

Place Value

- Count to and across 20, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number.
- Given a number, identify one ore and one less.
- Count, read and write numbers to 20 in numerals.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictoral representations.

Addition and Subtraction

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.
- Add and subtract one digit and two digit numbers to 20.
- Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction.

Literacy

This term our writing focus will be to...

• Use simple punctuation and correct letter formation.

We will be covering a range of writing genres including: Instructions, Fact Files, Character Descriptions, Story Writing, Recounts, Postcards and Posters.

Reading continues to be a huge focus around school and within Year 1. Please ensure that your child brings their reading book to school every day, so we can swap their books regularly.

Hearing your child read at home is extremely important. Can you also try and listen to your child read at least three times a week. This will really help your child with their fluency, pace and confidence. Remember asking lots of questions will check whether they understand what they are reading. Daily reading makes a huge difference to progress!
