Arriving Late to School

We appreciate that the majority of parents and carers make sure that their child/children arrive to school on time and prepared for the day ahead. However, we are seeing an increasing number of children arriving late to school with 9% arriving late on a single day this week. Not only does this disrupt the class but it means that your child may miss important instructions for the day ahead or information about the current lesson. Children also often find it embarrassing walking in to the class when their peers have started their learning. We understand that occasionally things may happen beyond your control making you late in the morning but we would be grateful if you could make every effort to ensure your child arrives to school on time. Any children who are late must be accompanied by their parent/carer to the school office to be registered.

Dumb Phones

With Christmas approaching you may be considering a mobile phone for your child. Some mobile companies offer 'Dumb' phone models which don't have access to the internet and additional apps. You may feel this a safer or more suitable option for your child particularly for children of primary school age. Please see this guide for further information about the different phone types available that may assist you if you are considering this as an option.

Smartphones vs. 'Dumb' phones

Guidance to help you choose the right mobile phone for your child.

Features

- Internet access to learn, play and browse;
- · Contact with friends and family through calls, texting and social apps,
- Built-in and additional parental controls available for safety; Tracking and monitoring abilities for parents;
- User-friendly keyboard and features;
- A range of models and price points;
- · Various mobile plans for data, messaging and calls.

- · Some models can be very expensive
- · Shorter battery life compared to a dumb phone







- Little or no app access except for built-in games on some mobiles to limit distractions:
- Contact with friends and family through calls and texting
- A selection of models and mobile plans at largely affordable price points;
- Longer battery life compared to smartphones

Limitations

- . No access to the internet or additional app
- . Communication restricted on many models to calls and text rather than apps that children's friends might us
- . Limited or no parental controls or tracking features for safety;
- · Text messaging is less user-friendly on many models.
