### Kent Libraries - The Winter Mini Challenge

Kent Libraries are launching an online winter reading challenge similar to those they have run previously during the summer holidays. This is called The Winter Mini Challenge and children simply read any books (including eBooks and audiobooks) of their choice (recommend reading at least three), then rate and review them at [www.wintermini.org.uk](http://www.wintermini.org.uk).

Books added to the website during the six-week Mini Challenge period will count towards unlocking special rewards including a certificate and a virtual badge. The website will also feature activities, recommendations for great winter reads, and competitions. And, just like the Summer Reading Challenge, the website will also feature the Book Sorter - a unique database which has over 1.3 million peer-to-peer recommendations. Over the school holidays children can experience 'dip' in reading skills and learning.


### **Challenge dates run from Tuesday, 1st December 2020 to Friday, 15th January 2021**
