Young Carers

A young carer is someone under the age of 18 who looks after a family member or friend who has a physical or mental health condition, or misuses drugs or alcohol. They may also look after brothers, sisters or elderly relatives too. Even the youngest children at Eastry may be classed as young carers. Being a young carer will impact on childhood and can effect school attendance and mean that they are unable to take part in out of school activities and meet with other children. For the first time this information is being collected during the School Census today.

We have added a Young Carers page to our website under our 'Safeguarding' tab. On this page you will find links to a number of support website which you may find helpful if your child is a young carer.

Please let us know if you think your child may be a young carer so that we can ensure they have access to support groups and activities both inside and outside of school.

Multi Factor Authentication (MFA)

Multi Factor Authentication is a cybersecurity best practise, now used by many organisations, yet some people may be unaware of this and understanding it's benefits.

MFA adds multi layers of security to protect you and your devices from those who may wish to access this without your authority. You may have seen this when accessing, for example, your on-line banking or shopping account, when a code is texted to your phone to confirm your identity. Although this extra step can seem tedious, by adding just one extra level of security, in addition to your password, can 99% make them less likely to be compromised.
