<u>Attendance</u>

At the beginning of each term we will be letting you know what the school attendance figure is for the current academic year. As of the end of term 3 our school attendance figure was 95%. Whilst we hope to keep the school attendance as near to 100% as possible we aim to ensure attendance is above 95% at all times.

We know parents and carers understand the importance of school attendance and the effect it can have on the education of children. We have produced a leaflet entitled 'Illness, Attendance and Absence from School - A Guide for Parents and Carers'. The aim of this leaflet is to help give parents advice on when children should be kept off of school and when it is OK for them to attend. If you have any questions concerning anything included in the leaflet please do let us know.

OTHER COMMUNITY NEWS

Information for parents and carers on Covid-19 vaccination for at risk 5 to 11 year olds Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the <u>Joint Committee on</u> <u>Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI)</u>. Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the <u>UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the</u> <u>Green Book</u>.

Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.

Further information is available in the <u>guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years</u> published by UKHSA. The government have published some <u>frequently asked questions</u> on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following <u>advice</u> from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

WhatsApp is the world's most popular messaging service, with around two billion users exchanging texts, photos, videos and documents, as well as making voice and visioo calls. Its end-to-end encryption means messages can only be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp can read them. Updates to its privacy policy in 2021 (involving sharing data with parent company, Facebook) caused millions to leave the app, but the new policy was widely misinterpreted – it only related to WhatsApp's business features, not to personal messages.
