Dear Parents/Carers

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the school community for their warm welcome and support over the past six months or so. I have been very pleased with how all pupils have started off this school year and the learning attitudes and behaviours in classrooms have been excellent. Earlier in the term we had skateboarding, fencing, archery and an inflatable laser quest outside which the children clearly loved. However, it was probably topped this week with the sight of our younger pupils charging around the hall on a variety of movable animals. These are just a few examples of some of the memorable experiences I hope your children will remember from the first term of this school year and we are certainly looking forward to many more to come – especially in the run up to Christmas I am sure.
