#### It's the 5th November!

Can you have your own Bonfire night at home? Eat some tasty treats hotdogs, burgers or even toffee apples! Can you make smores with your family? Make sure you take photos! What firework artwork can you create?

You can use glitter and glue, you can flick paint at black paper or you could create rockets using toilet paper tubes!

Make a poster about how to stay safe on Bonfire Night. How will you make it bright and interesting to read?

When you see **signs of winter**, go on a walk.

Collect anything you can, and take photographs.

Can you make labels for any of the things you find? OR

Make a **Stick Journey** - take a stick on a walk with you and wrap around string anything you find along the way in chronological order!

**Rangoli Patterns** are often made during the festival of Diwali.

Can you make your own Rangoli pattern? You could make it outside using chalk, using coloured rice, coloured sand or you could use doilies and tissue paper.

Can you make a list of all of the people we learned about in the **Nativity**Story? Make sure you don't leave any of them out!

Make a **shoebox stable** - Who was in the stable when Jesus was born? Can you make puppets of them? Can you act out the story using the puppets? You may need to rope in some family members to help you!

Make posters for the numbers 1 - 5.

Can you put the correct number of items on each piece of paper like we did with number 1 and 2?

#### Numberblocks:

Find some wooden boxes and create a numberblocks character! You might need some paint and big googly eyes! What could you use as the arms and legs?
