- ✓ We will be learning about, drawing and making creatures that live under the sea
- ✓ We will be writing sentences: descriptive sentences, factual sentences and sense sentences!
- ✓ We will even be uncovering....a real fish!
- ✓ We will be exploring different habitats – rock pools, coral reefs, the open ocean / ocean floor.
- ✓ We will be thinking about the qualities of a good friend, linked to the Rainbow Fish, before making our own individual scales before linking them together to make a huge fish!
