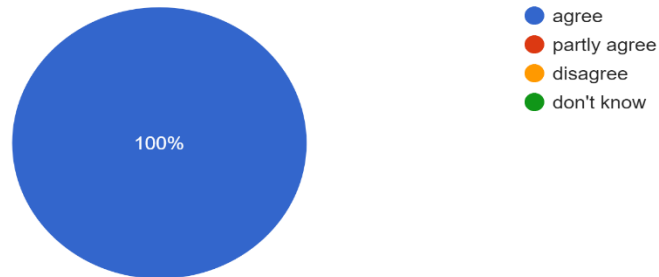


## Parent SEN questionnaire 2021-22

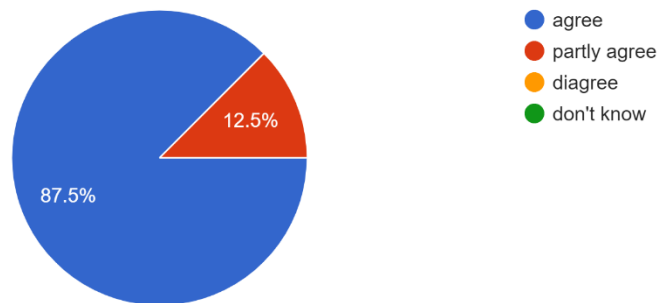
I know that my child is on the school SEN register and the reason for this.

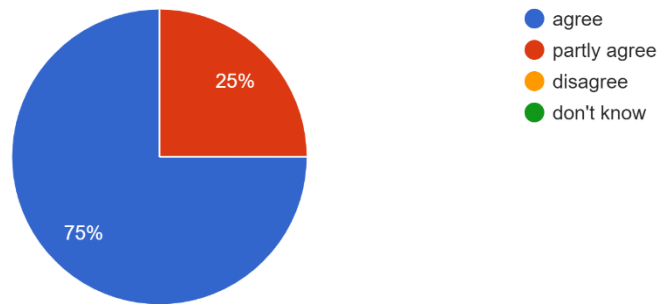

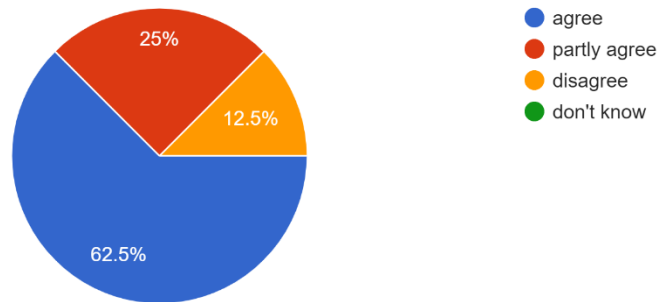

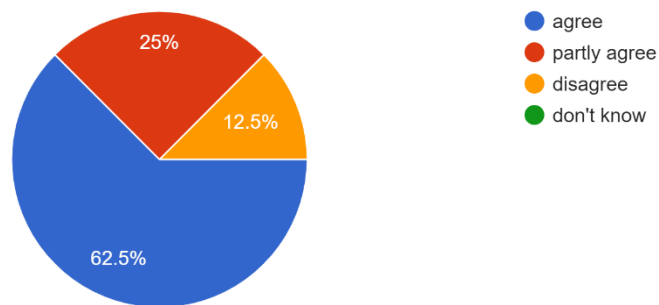
I feel that staff have given me suggestions of ways to support my child at home when I have asked

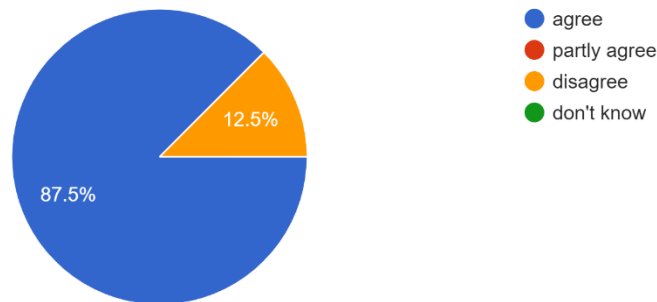


The school values all children, and pupils understand each others needs

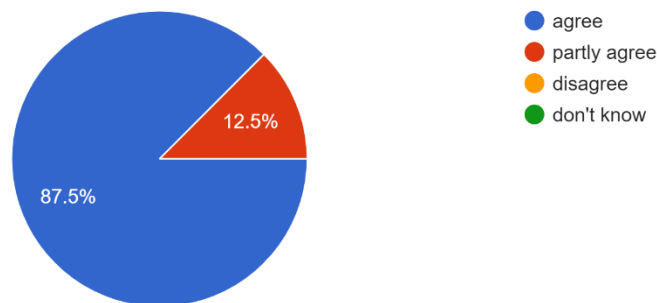

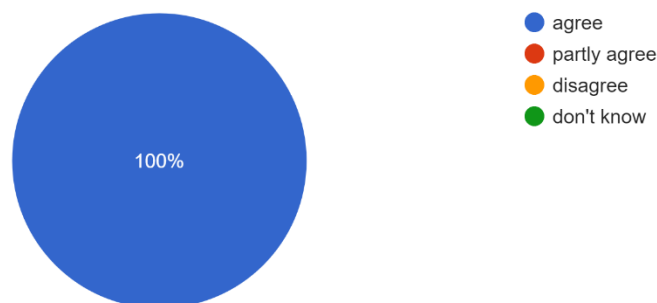
I feel involved with decisions made about my child
