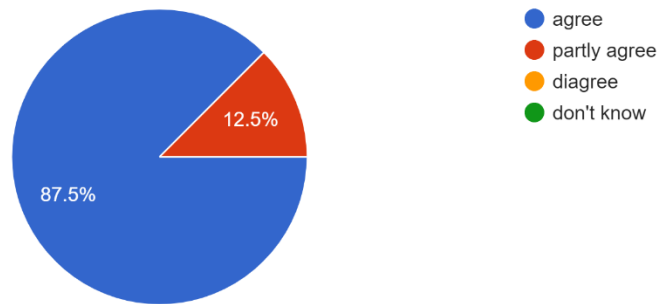

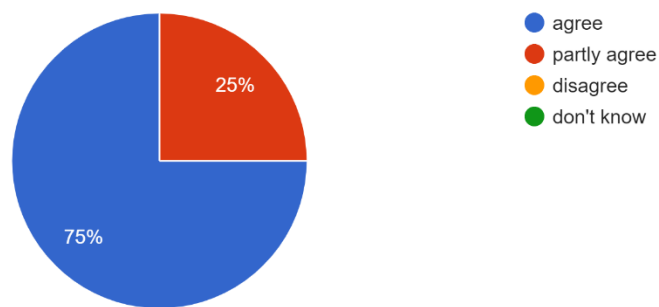
I know what is in place to help my child in school

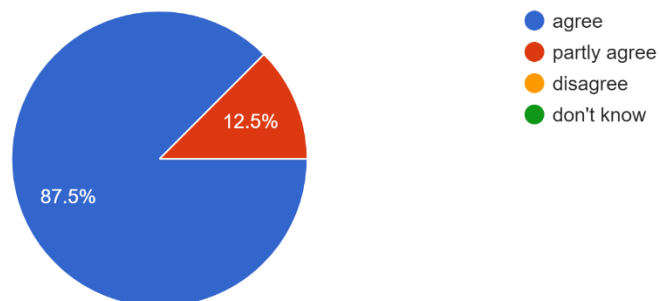
I am informed about my child's progress

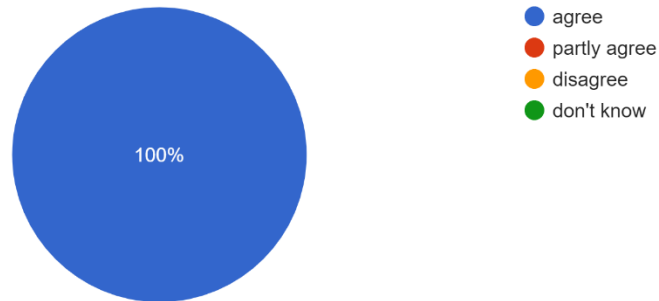
I know that my child is on the school SEN register and the reason for this.

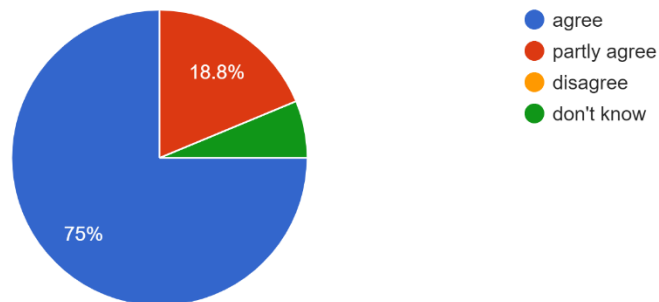
I am able to approach my child's teacher or support staff about any concerns I have regarding my child

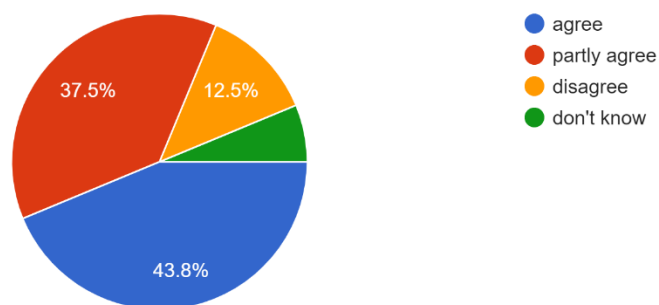

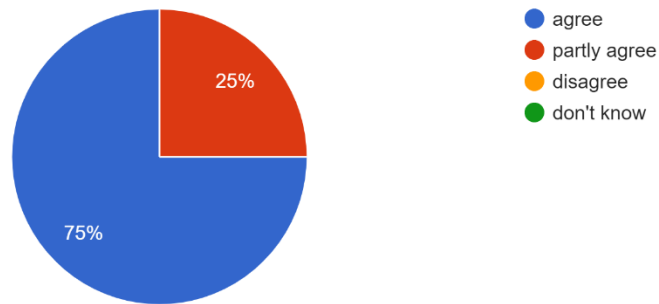


My child feels safe, happy and respected at school

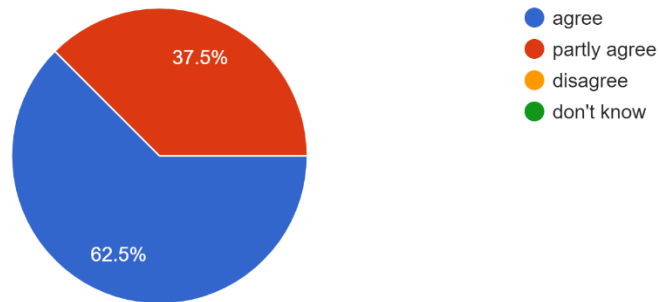

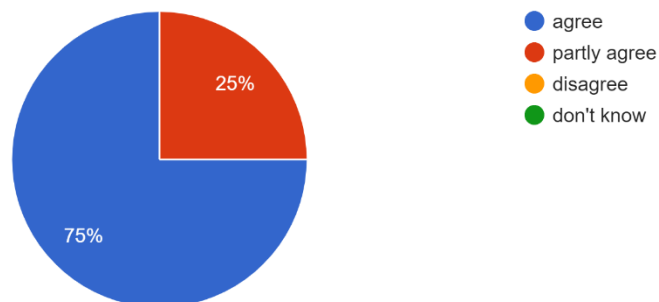

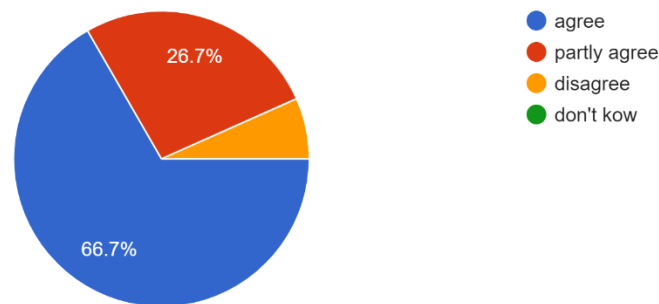


I feel involved with decisions made about my child

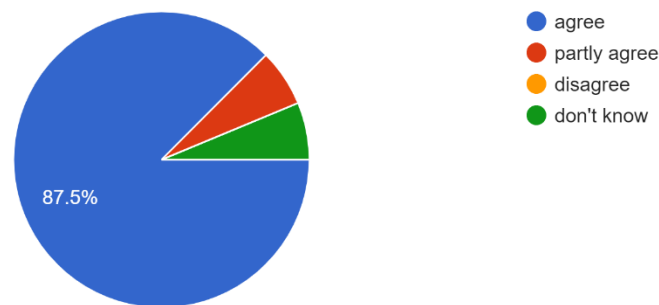
My child was well supported during the Covid Lock Downs- either in or out of school
