Teddy bear's picnic – 13th December

On the 13th December, we will be having our teddy bear's picnic. Your child will be able to come to school in their pyjamas (and dressing gowns!). We have an exciting day planned At 2:50, we invite you to come and share our jelly. You will then be asked to exit the classroom at 3:15, ready to collect your child from the playground at 3:25.

Hydration Station

You might have noticed your child returning home with stickers and receiving dojos for finishing their water bottle. After continuous verbal encouragement and drinking time— (as well as the freedom for your child to access their water bottle when they are thirsty), it was brought to my attention that some children were not drinking a satisfactory amount. We have introduced a new incentive to ensure your child is drinking when we ask them to. We will be keeping track each day on if your child finishes their water bottle. By Friday, if your child has got 5 ticks (a tick for each day with an empty bottle), they will receive a special 'big' sticker. Also, for each empty bottle they will receive a dojo point. We hope this incentive provides further encouragement for your child to drink when they are asked, as well as training the Koalas to drink an appropriate amount each day.
