

Year 3 news!

Dear parents,

This term, we are focussing our learning around the topic, 'Mighty Metals.' We shall be exploring the different types of metals, their properties and uses. We shall also be investigating what happens when they are put in different liquids and how they can be recycled. Art will be based around the same theme, with patterns using foils and sketching. In DT, children will be learning about how pneumatics are used and will use this to design and make a moving monster.

In English, we will be exploring a range of genres including, poetry and suspense writing based on the book, 'The Iron Man.' Alongside this, children will be taught GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling) and this term, the focus will be homophones and plurals.

In Maths, we will be building on from our learning of place value and learning the standard column method for addition and subtraction. We will also be learning strategies for multiplication and division.

Our RE learning this term will be all about the world faith, Sikhism.

Finally, Computing will consist of representing data in spreadsheets and graphs and in Science we will be learning all about forces and magnets. This will give children opportunities to explore the effects and types of forces as well as how magnets work.

So, it is sure to be yet another action-packed term!
