# The Arctic and Antarctica: poles apart?

Please find some useful information about our routines and our curriculum this term, to help you help the children make the most of their learning.

Following a fantastic term one, the children are ready to extend their learning into term 2. Children will continue with their PE and forest school on a Wednesday with Mrs Prestleton



Shackleton's Endurance across Antarctica. To help us with our learning we will focus on two texts – Ice Trap! by Meredith Hooper and – You wouldn't want to be on Shakleton's polar expedition! by Jen Green. Children will be putting themselves in the shoes of



Shackleton and his team and will be writing letters from their time at sea before using some persuasion for the men aboard the voyage.

Our reading in VIPERS sessions look at explaining what we have read in the text and using inference to identify an author's intended meaning.

Mathematics: Following White Rose Maths, we will be looking at units of work on area and multiplication and division. This will be the first-time children have learned about area and we will be looking at comparing areas and making rectilinear shapes to calculate area. Multiplication and division will be on 3,6,9,7,11 and 12 tables! So many skills to learn, however children will find this a lot easier by completing their TTRS.

Alongside this, we will be focussing on times tables ahead of government assessments.



#### Science: States of matter

We will be investigating the differences between solids, liquids and gasses. We will identify items and explain what category they are. We will also look at the wonder of water!



Computing: Our safety focus this term will be on managing online information, whilst our main unit of work looks at creating 3D logos

# RE: Christianity - What does incarnation mean to Christians?

Pupils will be revisiting their learning on the incarnation and considering why the Trinity is important to Christians.





Geography / History: Looking at the location of the polar regions, countries and seas. Comparison of physical and human geography between the Arctic, Antarctic and Eastry. Looking at climates and animal adaptations.

As well as weekly spellings, your child will also be learning a range of subject-specific vocabulary. They can practise writing and spelling these words, as well as using a dictionary to discover the definitions.

This year, in June, children will be sitting a statutory government assessment to check their multiplication knowledge. The test comprises 25 questions with 6 seconds to answer each question across all of the times tables. More information will be given in parental information sessions closer to the time.

The best way to help support your child to get ready for the test is by practising as much as possible, and especially on the Times Table Rockstars site (your child should have the details in their reading records). The school's home learning agreement states 5 minutes 5 times per week, however if they wish to do more, that is great too!

We will be practising our skills within the classroom to help secure children's knowledge, however, the sooner they begin to practise, the easier their recall and fluency will be. Throughout year 4 and beyond, multiplication plays an integral part in all maths learning, from fractions to statistics, from co-ordinates to decimals which is why a good, solid understanding will be beneficial for everything else that they learn.
