# Year 4 Class Information Term 4: Could you be the next pop sensation?

Please find some useful information about our routines and our curriculum this term, to help you help the children make the most of their learning.

We are looking forward to welcoming children back into term 4. PE will be held on a Thursday afternoon (PE kits in school please) and forest school will be on a Friday morning with Mrs Gleave.



English: During term 4, we will study these 2 texts in particular – Fiction; The Accidental Rockstar by Tom McLaughlin Non Fiction; Drum Dream Girl by Margarita Engle. Poetry will be based in The Sound Collector by Roger McGough. The style of writing we will focus on are biographies and story writing.





Mathematics: We continue to follow The White Rose Recovery Curriculum again combining new learning with revisiting topics and skills covered in year 3, giving confidence / filling any gaps that have arisen following the pandemic, whilst still moving learning on. Due to the upcoming government multiplication check, times tables are a big focus for this term.

We will complete the blocks on decimals and fractions.

**Science:** Sound as vibrations - Investigating how sounds are made and how we hear sounds as well as how to muffle sounds / make a musical instrument





Computing: Computer technology – recap hardware and software. Coding.

RE: Christianity – Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday?'



History: We will be looking at and comparing instruments and music during different eras.



Geography: Contrasting music from different cultures around the world



Music: Lean on me unit of work looking at composing and playing a composition.

**PE**: Elite – Football.



French: Vocabulary – learning the names of musical instruments and saying what we play.



**PSHE:** Relationships – identifying the relationships we have, our roles within them and how to work things out when those relationships change.

### **Vowel spotlight:**

Write your words using one colour for the vowels and another colour for the consonants. (vowels: a, e, i, o, u)

#### Wordsearch:

Create your own word search with your spellings. Show the answers to your puzzle in a different colour
