Our English unit is based upon the children's adventure story **'The Explorer'** by Katherine Rundell, and follows the adventures of four young children whose plane has crashed in the middle of the Amazon rainforest- will they survive?! This story will inspire **letter-writing**, **adventure-story writing**, and **explanation text writing**. Regular spelling, grammar, punctuation and handwriting practise is also part of the curriculum. Whole-class reading and comprehension activities will take place daily.

Independent reading books and reading journals MUST be taken home each day. These will be checked regularly to make sure that children are **reading daily at home, for approx. 30 mins per day.** When books are read, a comprehension quiz must be taken in school.

All home learning activities should be handed in on a Thursday; these will include daily reading and arithmetic/times tables that will all be set on a Friday.
