Our English unit is based upon 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick and will include a range of letter-writing styles, persuasive speech writing and information writing. Regular spelling, grammar, punctuation and handwriting practise is also part of the curriculum. Whole-class reading and comprehension activities will take place daily. Maths will include learning about *fractions, geometry (position and direction) and decimals, well as applied problem-solving and reasoning.*

Independent reading books can be changed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and reading journals will be checked regularly to make sure that children are **reading daily at home**.

All home learning activities should be handed in on a Thursday; these will include arithmetic, spelling and reading comprehension. They will all be set on a Friday.
