Our English unit is based entirely on Williams Shakespeare's play 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. This will be our class production for the end of year 6.

Regular spelling, grammar, punctuation and handwriting practise is also part of the curriculum. **Whole-class reading and VIPERS comprehension activities will take place daily.**

Maths will include learning about geometry and statistics. *Applied problem-solving and reasoning will continue alongside all maths units.*

Independent reading books can be changed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and children will be able to take their Star Reading quiz when they have completed their book. Reading journals will be checked regularly to make sure that children are **reading daily at home.**

All home learning activities should be **handed in on a Thursday**; these will include **arithmetic, spelling and GPS activities (grammar, punctuation and spelling)**. They will **all be set on a Friday.**
