

# **KEY SAFETY TIPS FOR CHILDREN**

#### Do not talk to strangers

If someone you don't know approaches you, keep a safe distance and do not engage in conversation.

#### Never accept gifts or lifts

Even if someone offers sweets, money, or a lift, always say no and walk away quickly.

#### Stay in safe areas

Avoid walking alone in quiet places. Stick to well-lit, busy areas where there are other people around.

#### Tell a trusted adult

Always let your parents or carers know where you are going and when you will be home.

## Know what to do in an emergency

If you ever feel scared or threatened, run to a safe place, such as a shop or a friend's house, and call 999 if necessary.

By following these simple rules, children can help keep themselves safe when out and about. We encourage all parents and carers to discuss these safety tips with their children to reinforce the importance of staying aware and making safe choices.









#### Important Update - Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices

#### Information for Parents

You may be aware that the Department for Education has announced national changes to the use of penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period<sup>1</sup>. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child
  within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another
  course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the
  other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

#### Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning

This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential
