Year 4 carried out Geography fieldwork this week to investigate an important issue in their local community. They identified four roads that they felt would benefit from the introduction of cycle paths, selecting these locations for reasons such as proximity to schools, shops and leisure facilities.

During the fieldwork, the children took photographs, created observational drawings, interviewed local residents and conducted traffic counts. They then used their findings to write a letter to Knutsford Town Council, sharing their research and recommendations. We are looking forward to hearing their response.

This week, the children in Reception met the lambs from Tatton Farm, Winnie and Roo. We were able to feed them and stroke them and ask lots of questions about how they are looked after and how quickly they grow. The children were so excited to meet them, and it was a lovely experience for all.



What a brilliant week it has been in Year 5! In **English**, we explored landfills, discussing the environmental drawbacks of discarding large quantities of items and considering alternative solutions. It was inspiring to see the children think critically about how our choices affect the planet. In **Geography**, we explored Mexico's physical features and wrote postcards to friends describing what we discovered. In **Art**, the children created self-portraits in the style of Frida Kahlo, experimenting with bold colours and expressive details to capture emotion and personality. To round off the week, we were delighted to enjoy an **extra PE lesson**, giving the children a chance to be active, work together and work as a team. It has been a joy to see Year 5 so engaged, support one another and put their all into every subject!

In Geography, we have been comparing the weather and climate in Sydney and London. The children explored the differences between the two locations and discussed how climate affects daily life. They then used their knowledge to create detailed trioramas of either Sydney or London, carefully including important landmarks and features that we have been learning about. The finished models look fantastic and show great attention to detail.

To celebrate May Day, we learnt about where the tradition comes from and why it is celebrated. We also talked about how we will be getting involved this year. The children designed and painted their own colourful bunting, which is now proudly decorating our classroom and helping us mark the occasion.

It has been a busy and imaginative week, and the children should be very proud of their creativity and effort.





Continuing with our farm topic in Nursery, we have shared the story 'Farmer Duck'. The children practiced their sequencing skills and we introduced drawing club. The children drew a picture linked to the story and identified the first sound in their picture. We had great fun in the school hall playing farmers in the den and exploring 'Old McDonald' with the parachute. Our younger children continued to learn more about farm animals. They enjoyed learning and singing new songs and rhymes.



Year 1 have been thoroughly enjoying art this week as they continue learning about Esther Mahlangu and her vibrant artwork. The children loved creating replicas of one of her pieces using oil pastels, carefully thinking about the same colours, shapes and patterns. Many showed great focus and creativity and after completing their replicas, some children went on to design their own unique pieces.

Year 6 had a fantastic week in PE! The class enjoyed their lessons so much that they even managed to squeeze in an extra hour of physical activity. Multiflex staff spent time assessing the children's running, throwing, football, and cricket skills, giving everyone a chance to shine. The beautiful weather held out all week, making the sessions even more enjoyable and helping Year 6 make the most of their time outdoors. This extra PE time was especially welcome, as the children have been working incredibly hard in class in preparation for their SATs.
