This week, Year 2 had an unforgettable adventure on their first ever residential trip to Burwardsley! They spent two nights and three days exploring the great outdoors, trying new things, and making memories that will last a lifetime. The children loved every minute, from pond dipping and mini-beast hunting to a 5K habitat walk and orienteering. A big highlight was their visit to the Ice Cream Farm, which was a well-earned treat! They also picked up some brilliant life skills, like making their own beds and enjoying meals away from home. It was amazing to see friendships grow even stronger as they spent time together in the sunshine. We're so proud of every single member of Year 2 — you were all stars and made the most of every moment!
