Year 2 have had another fantastic week of learning and exploring!

In Maths, the children have continued to build their confidence with addition. Using base ten equipment, they have been working hard on adding two two-digit numbers. This week we have been perfecting the column method, and it has been brilliant to see how quickly the children are spotting patterns and using their strategies independently. Their enthusiasm and determination are really shining through. In Geography, we have been learning all about human and physical features. The children enjoyed investigating our own local area, using digital maps to spot examples of each type of feature. We even looked at aerial maps and were amazed to find our school from above – it was exciting to recognise familiar places from such a different perspective!

It has been wonderful to see the children so engaged, asking thoughtful questions and making connections in their learning. We are very proud of the effort and curiosity they are showing each day.







This week the children have been listening to 'Cake' by Sue Hendra. We have enjoyed listening to the story, making play dough cakes and developing our fine motor skills by making paper chains. On Monday, we made fairy cakes after chatting about what we do to celebrate birthdays with our own families.









The children took great care in designing beautiful pages all about weaving, inspired by the artist Anni Albers. This week in Nursery we have been talking about our emotions, the children enjoyed to the story of the Colour Monster and during hall time we acted out using our gross motor skills all the different emotions using streamers. We finished "Our House" where the children spoke about who lives in their house, and cut out and coloured in everyone in their home, all the houses should now have been taken home. The children enjoyed the story "A Family is Like a Cake" by Shona Innes, they then made a family cake using all the ingredients you need to make a family, sugar for kindness, butter for care, eggs for sharing, icing for celebrations, milk for gentleness and baking powder for patience! The children had a wonderful time making the family cake!



This week in History, Year 6 have been learning all about Victorian workhouses. The children discovered what life was like for the poor who had no choice but to enter the workhouse, and thought carefully about the harsh rules, strict routines, and tough jobs people had to do.

To showcase their learning, the children created fantastic drawing and information pages in the shape of a factory – a creative way to bring history to life!

• Did you know? Some workhouses were so strict that families were often split up, with children living in separate parts of the building from their parents.

This week in English, Year 1 sequenced the parts of our Pathways to Write book *Meesha Makes Friends* that they have learnt so far, using adverbs. The children have also been working really hard on their use of capital letters and full stops!















Year 5 had a great science lesson on Tuesday. We were testing the hardness of different materials by scratching them with different items. We then discussed how each material would be suited to particular purposes based on our results. Well done year 5, great job working scientifically!
