


This week in Reception, the children have been learning about different types of transport and what transport looked like in the past. In Drawing Club the children watched an episode of Wacky Races and used it as inspiration to design their own vehicles and race mascots. We compared photographs of transport from the past and the present to see how things have changed and progressed.



As part of their Geography learning, Year 4 have been completing fieldwork sketches of different sections of a river. They have used observational drawings and labelled the key features of the upper, middle and lower course. They can identify meanders, confluences, tributaries, the mouth and the source. They have also learnt why rivers are so important and linked this to their previous learning about settlements. Well done Year 4!

This week, Year 5 have been creating some amazing artwork inspired by Nerys Levy. The children have done so well to create their own contemporary paintings using complimentary and contrasting colours and also by creating tints and shades. Well done, Year 5.



This week, Year 6 had a fantastic time taking part in a Brazil drumming workshop. The children explored the rhythms and sounds of traditional Brazilian music, learning to play drums and percussion instruments with great enthusiasm. It was wonderful to see them working together, developing their musical skills, and having so much fun in the process!



Nursery have been learning all about 'The Little Red Hen' and have been very creative, producing some wonderful story maps. They enjoyed acting out the story using different actions for each animal. The younger children have listed to lots of farm stories, exploring farm animals, their sounds, and babies. It was lovely to listen to them singing 'Old McDonald Had A Farm'.

Year 1 have produced some great writing this week, and we are so proud of their efforts. They created wonderful descriptions of the lion or the mouse, using thoughtful vocabulary and trying to use the -er and -est suffixes. The children also wrote sentences explaining how the mouse felt at different points in our story *The Lion Inside*, showing a growing understanding of characters' emotions. We are very excited to see their re-writes of the story next week!



On Wednesday, Year 2 were treated to a samba drumming workshop with Dr Drums! The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring a variety of instruments, including the surdo drums and agogo bells. They learned all about samba music, its rhythms, and how the instruments work together. Working as a team, they played together to create fantastic music, showing great focus and enthusiasm throughout the session. It was a fun and lively experience that the children will remember!
