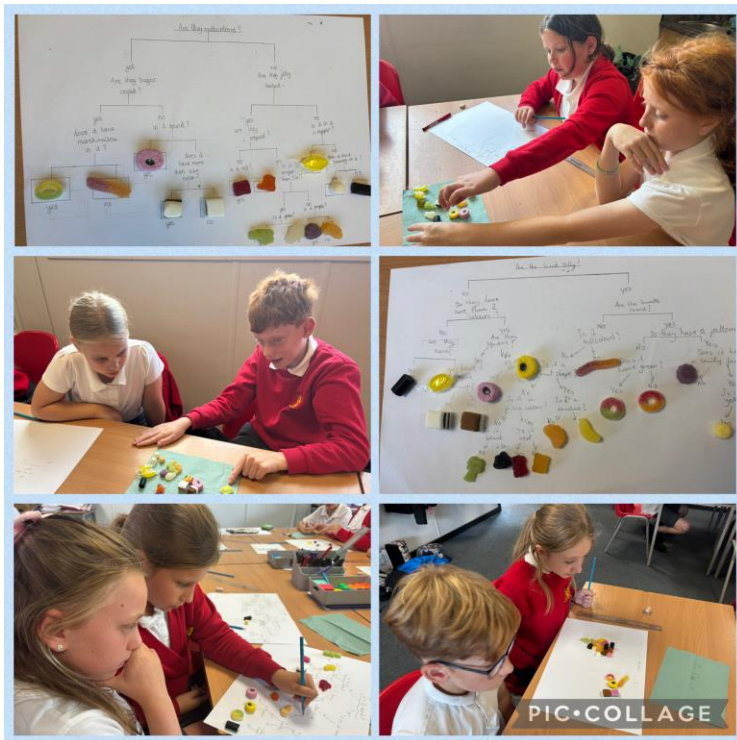

We have had a great first week in Reception! The children have settled amazingly, and we couldn't be prouder of them all! These are just a few photos of some of the things the children have been getting up to. Well done for such a splendid week reception!

Year 2 have had a fantastic week of learning! In maths, we have been partitioning two-digit numbers and practising comparing numbers using the greater than and less than symbols. In geography, we explored different types of maps and enjoyed playing a fun map detective game. We also used compass points to follow directions and find our way around a treasure map. What an exciting week of discovery!





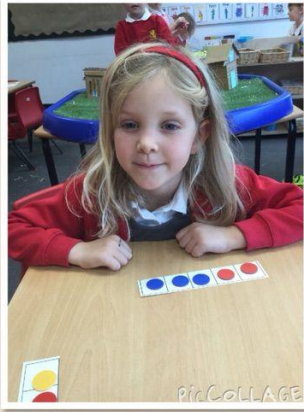
Year 6 have had a fantastic week! The children have settled into their new class with enthusiasm and quickly adapted to new routines. They have worked very hard in all subjects, showing determination and focus right from the start.

In English, the children have been developing their writing and discussion skills and created fantastic descriptions of New York. In Science, we launched our topic on classification. To explore how scientists sort and group living things, we carried out a fun practical activity where we classified sweets according to their different features. This hands-on task helped everyone understand how classification works in an enjoyable and memorable way!

It has been a really positive week, and we are very proud of how Year 6 have approached their learning. We are looking forward to seeing their curiosity and effort continue to grow as the term progresses.



This week in Nursery we have been welcoming and making new friends, and have begun to settle back into Nursery class routines. The children have particularly enjoyed imaginary play, exploring the musical instruments, sharing stories and expressing themselves to music during sticky kids. It's been a wonderful first full week in nursery, the children have all done so well and we are all very proud of them.



In Maths this week, Year 1 explored numbers using a 5 frame. The children enjoyed making different numbers and explaining their thinking. For example, one child shared, “*I made 4. 2 and 2 makes 4.*” This activity helped everyone to see how numbers can be built in different ways while developing confidence in talking about their mathematical ideas.



This week, Year 4 kicked off their new science topic all about the human digestive system. They found out what happens to our food after we eat it and learned about the different organs that help with digestion and the jobs they do. The children worked really hard to draw scientific diagrams showing the key parts of the digestive system and labelled them carefully. They also had lots of fun trying to locate the organs on their own bodies, which helped them understand where everything is and how it all works together. It’s been a brilliant start to the topic—well done, Year 4!
