This week, Year 3 had the incredible opportunity to meet Mr Egypt! It was a fantastic day, packed with fun, fascinating facts, and valuable learning. The children explored a range of topics and had first-hand experiences with artefacts and stories from the Valley of the Kings. They are now true Egyptian experts!



This week the Reception children have been making gingerbread men after reading the traditional tale. Mysteriously, one of the 27 baked escaped from the oven and caused havoc in the kitchen spilling flour all over the floor! We followed the escapee's floury trail and found him hiding in the bean plants! What a little minx!



This week in Nursery class, we have been busy making Father's Day cards, where the children completed a questionnaire with staff about their daddy, with some funny responses! Our storybook this week has been Mr Gumpy's Outing by John Burningham, which led us to talk to the children about what objects will sink in water and which, might float. The children were given a choice of items to predict which would float or sink, they then tested these in the water tray, we were surprised at some of the results, but mostly the children predicted right!







Year 4 have really enjoyed starting their new science unit on sound! They discovered what is hidden inside their ears and were fascinated by the size of the tiny bones. Did you know the eardrum is only 1 cm wide? They also investigated how sound waves travel differently through solids, liquids, and gases. The class carried out four exciting experiments to test this. Our favourite was watching salt *dance* to the Spice Girls!





We have really enjoyed our LEGO workshop in Year 5 today! The children have built algorithms to control motor, sounds, pictures and lights. Then they used the motor to investigate gears and pulleys. This afternoon, the children have been using cams devices to move a mechanical monkey!



The Year 6 netball girls have been incredibly busy—defeating (which is up to debate) both staff and parents in some very entertaining matches! The games were full of energy and laughter, creating memories that will last a lifetime. A huge thank you to the staff and parents for getting involved and making these events possible.
