This week, our Year 6 children have been diving deep into the fascinating world of the circulatory system! They've explored how the heart, blood vessels, and blood work together to keep our bodies functioning. As part of their lessons, the children discovered the key components of blood: red blood cells, which carry oxygen; white blood cells, which help fight off infections; platelets, which are crucial for clotting; and plasma, the liquid that transports nutrients, hormones, and waste products. They have researched and created detailed posters to showcase their knowledge!




As part of our work on seasons, the children in Reception went for a walk on our school field to look for signs of autumn. We wore our coats because we felt the chill and looked at trees to work out whether they were deciduous or evergreen. When we had finished, we used some of the leaves we had collected to make autumn fairies. Great work Reception.



Class 1 have started their new computing unit, algorithms. To understand the importance of instructions being specific, they were giving commands to their partner of how to build the same Lego structure. They also then independently followed instructions on Purple Mash to complete the painting template, ensuring everyone's looked the same.



This week in Forest School, year 4s have been learning how to light a fire using a flint and cotton wool (or tinder). We enjoyed seeing the sparks and lots of us managed to light a fire. These skills will come in handy when we will soon be enjoying a campfire!



Year 2 have been learning about hygiene and the importance of washing hands to prevent the spread of germs, in Science this week. As part of their lesson, they carried out an experiment to discover if soap really helps keep germs away. The children covered their hands in pretend 'germs,' and then one child washed their hands with only water while another used soap and water. When exploring the results, they concluded that soap helped remove more 'germs.' Can you guess who used the soap? Year 2 also learned about our class scientist, Louis Pasteur. They discovered how his research helped scientists and people understand that germs are the cause of many illnesses.



In nursery class this week we added to our bonfire freeze, as the children came in on Monday still talking about the firework displays they'd been too, so we made 3D junk modelling rockets to take home and to add to the freeze. We have shared the story "What Ever Next" by Jill Murphy, this has inspired the children to role play the story. The children have spoken about the dark nights and the moon and we were excited to receive some light reflectors from Mrs Lowe to help us keep safe in the dark.
