Year 3 have been busy scientists this week as they investigated the different properties of rocks. Through a fun, hands-on enquiry, the children explored which rocks would be best suited for different jobs, helping characters such as *Bob the Builder* decide which rock would make the strongest roof, the most practical kitchen worktop, and the most suitable material for a monument. The children thoroughly enjoyed testing, comparing, and discussing the rocks, developing their scientific thinking and discovering how different rocks are used for different purposes in the real world.



This week has been very busy in Reception! We have been learning about 'one more' in maths and making 1-5 staircases using blocks. In our Drawing Club sessions, we watched an Episode of Mr Benn where we saw him turn into a spaceman and explore different planets. This inspired our writing where we imagined what the other planets might have on them, including aliens! As well as all this, the children have been using the big blocks to make some impressive structures too!



This week in Year 5, in our Science lessons, we have been learning about the anatomy of flowers. Children really enjoyed using a microscope to investigate the different parts of the flower in more detail. Children were able to label the different parts of the flower, such as the style, stigma, stamen, ovules and sepal. We also explored how pollination works and the different ways in which plants can reproduce.

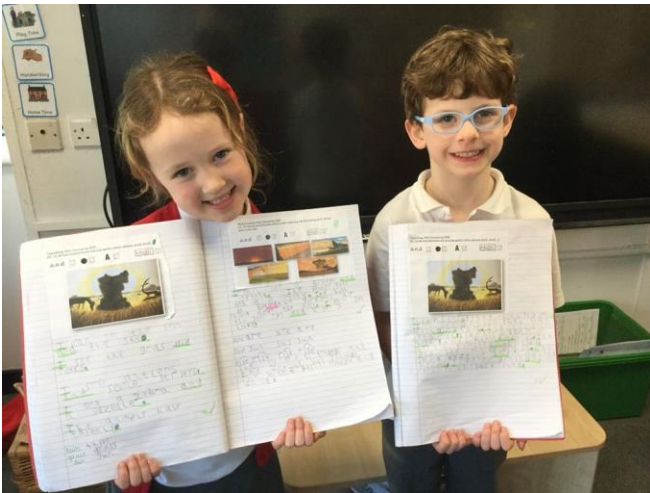


This week in Nursery as our new children continue to settle, we have introduced them to our sticky kids, dough gym, and storytelling activities to name a few. They have enjoyed practicing their dance moves, fine and gross motor skills and practicing repetitive phrases. What a fantastic week!





Year 4 became Romans this week! The children dressed up as Emperors, Gods, and Roman citizens and spent the day fully immersed in Roman history. They took part in Roman army training, completing a range of drills that developed teamwork, speed, agility, coordination, balance, and discipline as they worked together as a legion. In class, the children wrote thoughtful letters to the Romans, thanking them for the lasting influence of Roman ideas such as roads, towns, language, the calendar, and laws, which still shape our lives today. To finish the day, the children designed Roman coins to celebrate our emperor, Emperor Capperonius, carefully choosing symbols and designs just like real Roman coins. It was a fantastic day, and the children embraced the challenge with enthusiasm and creativity throughout.



This week, Year 1 have started their new writing unit, The Lion Inside. The children have been writing sentences using their mastery keys, focusing on capital letters, full stops and using 'and' to join ideas together. Year 1 are making lots of progress in their writing – well done!
