Year 3

Year 3 have had an amazing first week back! With our focus on rivers this term, we have begun exploring what rivers are, identifying different river features, and learning about some famous rivers such as the Colorado River at the Grand Canyon. Keeping with the water theme, the children also had their first swimming lesson with the school. They behaved excellently and showed great independence and maturity throughout the session—well done, Year 3!



This week in Reception we started our music project with Love Music Trust called Teach Rex. It is a fun and engaging singing and music programme run by Mrs BW and the children loved the first session on Monday. Looking forward to next week!



Year 4 really enjoyed their cycle training with Bikeability this week. They learned many important skills, including how to carry out basic safety checks on their bikes, start and stop safely, signal clearly, maintain control and balance, and develop awareness of their surroundings and other road users. They also practised safe positioning on the road and how to make simple decisions when riding. Alongside building these valuable skills, the children had lots of fun throughout the sessions. A huge thank you to the Bikeability team for the amazing lesson, we really appreciate it!



In Science this week, Year 1 explored their five senses. They learned that to smell, touch, taste, see and hear, they need help from different parts of their body. The children really enjoyed playing a matching game, linking each body part to the correct sense. They also took some fantastic photos for our Animals Including Humans display!

Year 6 have begun an important and engaging new unit in Geography, focusing on the growing global issue of plastic waste. This week, the children started by researching what plastic waste is, where it comes from, and why it has become such a significant environmental challenge. They explored how everyday items—such as packaging, bottles and bags—can have a long-lasting impact on our planet, particularly when they are not recycled properly. Pupils were especially interested to learn about the journey of plastic waste into our oceans and the harmful effects this has on marine life and ecosystems. Over the coming weeks, Year 6 will deepen their understanding by examining global patterns of plastic use, identifying which countries produce the most waste, and considering the role individuals, communities and governments can play in reducing plastic pollution. They will also investigate sustainable alternatives and reflect on how their own choices can make a positive difference.



This week in Year 2, we have been learning all about Florence Nightingale as part of our new history topic. We have explored her life and found out why she is such an important person from the past. The children have worked together on timeline activities, created fun fact posters and even had a go at sketching her. We have been very impressed with their enthusiasm and the thoughtful work they have produced.
