During PE, Year 4 split into groups to create an obstacle course designed to develop their fitness skills. The aim was to build a course that would challenge their stamina, as well as their running, jumping, and agility skills. I was really impressed with how well the children worked together and how confidently they demonstrated their courses. Well done, Year 4!



Year 2 have had another busy and exciting week of learning! In Reading lessons, the children have been working hard and having lots of fun playing vocabulary games to explore new words and deepen their understanding of texts. It's been wonderful to see how confidently they can use adventurous vocabulary in their discussions and writing.

In RE, we have been learning about Christianity and thinking carefully about why the Bible is such a special book for Christians. The children have enjoyed hearing different stories from the Bible and reflecting on what each one can teach us about kindness, honesty and making good choices. They shared thoughtful ideas about the morals in these stories and why they continue to be so important to Christians today.

It's been lovely to see so much enthusiasm and curiosity across all of our learning this week – well done, Year 2!



This week in Reception we have been reading Supertato by Sue Hendra. Thank you to everyone for bringing in potatoes this week, the children loved making their own Supertato characters. As well as this, the children have been playing with superhero toys and telling their own stories using role play costumes and small world characters. We have had a lovely week!



Year 3 had an amazing time visiting Delamere Forest! The children explored and learned all about the Stone Age, discovering fascinating facts about how people lived long ago. They enjoyed creating their own Stone Age art and exploring the timeline of history, understanding where the Stone Age fits in. We are so proud of their excellent behaviour, curiosity, and enthusiasm throughout the day — they were a joy to take on the trip!

Year 6 have been busy acting as young scientists this week as they explored the question: "Is yeast a microorganism?" Using plastic bottles, yeast, sugar, and warm water, the children set up an exciting experiment to observe what happens when yeast becomes active. They soon discovered that when yeast is mixed with warm water and sugar, it begins to produce gas, which made the balloons on top of their bottles inflate! The children learned that although we can see yeast granules, each one is made up of millions of tiny yeast cells, which are microorganisms too small to see without a microscope. When given warmth and sugar, the yeast respires, releasing carbon dioxide — the same process that makes bread rise!





This week in Nursery we have been learning all about hedgehogs; we asked about where they live and has anyone seen one. We played a hibernation game where the children rolled up into small balls to imitate the hedgehogs going to sleep in the Winter and then waking up again in the spring. The children made some wonderful hedgehogs from clay to take home and made dens using leaves from the garden to show where they live and sleep. We enjoyed singing "I'm a little hedgehog" song to the tune of I'm a little teapot. During maths the children have been matching pairs of socks and colours and for sensory learning they felt socks filled with different materials to find the matching pairs! It's been a wonderful few weeks exploring this colourful season and everything that comes with it!
