Year 4 loved science week! Firstly, we explored how climate change is affecting glaciers and polar animals. We learnt that many Polar animals are losing their habitat and hunting places. To investigate if increased warmer weather is making a difference, we recreated an Arctic habitat and placed icebergs (ice cubes) in the habitat. We then poured room temperature on one set of ice cubes and then hot water on the second set of ice cubes. We noticed the ice cubes with the warmer weather melted a lot quicker and there was an increase in the water level. This proved to us that Climate change is causing glaciers to melt quicker and this is then causing problems for polar animals.

We also looked at how Climate change and melting glaciers are resulting in rising sea levels. We decided to test this by creating our own iceberg and measuring the water depth as the iceberg melted throughout the day.

Finally, we made a water cycle in a bag! We placed one water cycle in the window in a hot place and one in the cloakroom in a cold place. We want to see if increased heat makes a difference to the evaporation and condensation process, as well as showing us if Climate change is making a different to the water cycle. We enjoyed presenting our findings from the week in a handy guide and included what we can do to help Climate change and to help to reduce the speed in which the glaciers are melting.



This week in PE, the Reception children have been learning some of the gymnastic shapes. Here they are demonstrating the pike, straight shape, tuck and a straddle. Great work!



This term in Art, Year 6 children are exploring *still life*—a genre that focuses on drawing and painting everyday objects. They have been sketching apples, carefully observing their shape, texture, and shading to create realistic drawings.

As part of their learning, they are studying famous still-life practitioners and experimenting with different techniques to capture light, shadow, and depth. Using materials such as pencil, charcoal, and pastels, they are refining their observational skills and exploring composition and perspective.

We look forward to seeing their wonderful artwork as they continue developing their creativity!



This week in Nursery, we have been talking about our feelings, by listening to stories about being happy, sad, angry and frightened. We have been talking about the Colour Monster story and the different colours that are connected to how we are feeling. Please look out for our display of what makes us happy in the playroom! We have also been practicing our cutting skills by cutting out hearts ready for our kindness tree next week.
