


Year 3 have been developing their research skills this week and have looked incredibly mature and professional in the classroom. As part of our English learning, the children explored a range of odd and interesting creatures before choosing one of their own to research. They confidently searched for information and facts about their chosen animal in preparation for creating an amazing fact file by the end of the week. The children were highly engaged and showed great curiosity and enthusiasm throughout the process — we are very proud of their efforts!



This week we have been invaded by dinosaurs in Reception. We have read the book 'Are the Dinosaurs Dead Dad?' by Julie Middleton and completed writing based on the book. We have also learnt about carnivores and herbivores and how we can identify them. Artemis even brought a real fossil that was found on the beach in to show us all.



Year 6 have been showcasing their incredible artistic skills through detailed pencil sketches this week. With a real focus on tone, shading and proportion, pupils have shown impressive patience and creativity, producing work they can be truly proud of. It's been wonderful to see their confidence grow as they experiment with techniques and refine their drawings to a high standard.



Year 2 have had another busy and exciting week of learning!

In PSHE, we have been learning all about the internet and what we use it for at home. The children talked about the different ways they go online and worked together to complete a class survey to find out the most popular internet activities in our homes. We also explored how to stay safe online, discussing different scenarios and what we can do to keep ourselves safe when using the internet. The children shared thoughtful ideas and showed a great understanding of how to make sensible choices online. In Reading, the children have been enjoying a variety of chapter books. They have been sharing their thoughts, talking about what they like (and don't like!), and recommending books to their friends — helping to build a real love of reading and excitement about books. To help us look after our new books, we got creative and made our own corner bookmarks. We designed and decorated them in lots of fun styles, including owls, monsters, bunnies, and many more imaginative creations. They look fantastic and will help us keep our place while we read! Well done, Year 2 — another brilliant week of learning



This week in Science, the Year 1 children first explored a range of different objects by passing them around the circle and discussing their properties. They then took part in an object sorting activity to explore different materials and what they are like. Using a range of everyday objects, the children sorted items into groups labelled with properties such as soft and hard. They discussed their choices, building their confidence in using scientific vocabulary.



This week in Nursery we've enjoyed exploring with the ribbons in the school hall and using our gross motor skills. The children made some lovely lines, zig zags and circles. We shared lot of nursery rhymes learning numbers and supporting our counting skills. We also explored lots of different ways to keep warm, running on the spot, jumping jacks and many other exercises.
