This week the children have been planting beans. We talked about all the things a seed needs to help it to grow into a strong healthy plant. The children know that we need water, warmth, sunshine and time. We read a story called Jasper's Beanstalk and learnt that growing things takes a little bit of patience so we are hopeful that those first shoots make an appearance late next week.



Year 4 have had a fantastic week learning outdoors. In Science, they have been exploring animal habitats and used the school field to identify different habitats around the grounds. In Geography, linking to our topic on India, they researched a large Indian city and then created a Jet2Holidays-inspired advert to encourage people to visit by showcasing the human and physical features of the city. It was lovely to use our school grounds to support our learning, and I was really impressed with how hard Year 4 worked and the teamwork they showed. Well done, everyone!



In Nursery we've been learning all about the farm and we had some very special visitors from Tatton Park. The children got to meet two lambs 'Pigglet' and 'Tigger' who were only 3 weeks old. The children had thought of some questions to ask to learn more about farming life. We took part in a virtual farm tour and explored how farms are an important part of community life. The children enjoyed some messy farm play, singing farm songs and sharing lots of lovely farming stories.



Year 1 had a fantastic week of learning! In Science, the children explored the human body by labelling diagrams and discussing what different body parts are used for. They then took their learning outdoors, using chalk to draw their own life-sized human bodies—such a fun way to bring science to life!

In Art, the children were introduced to our new artist, **Esther Mahlangu**. They learned about her vibrant geometric artwork and created some wonderful exploration pages in their sketchbooks inspired by her style!

This week, Year 2 have had an amazing time on our residential visit to Burwardsley. The children threw themselves into every activity and showed fantastic enthusiasm throughout.

They took part in orienteering, a forest walk, den building, a mini beast investigation and pond dipping. It was wonderful to see them exploring the outdoors, working together and developing their independence.

The children used a wide range of skills including teamwork, problem solving, resilience and curiosity. They challenged themselves, supported one another and made us all very proud.
