Year 2 have had a wonderfully busy week full of learning and hard work! In reading, the children have been practising their fluency by echo reading our class text *The Enormous Carrot*. They have loved adding expression, actions and intonation to bring the story to life – it's been brilliant to see their confidence growing with every read. Alongside this, we've been playing a range of exciting vocabulary games to make sure we fully understand the tricky words in the story, and the children have impressed us with how quickly they are learning and remembering new vocabulary. In PSHE, we've been thinking carefully about good manners and politeness, acting out different real-life scenarios such as mealtimes, birthday parties and even how to greet others in a kind and respectful way. The children enjoyed sharing their ideas and showed how thoughtful they can be about the feelings of others. In geography, we have been continuing our exploration of maps. This week we focused on identifying map symbols, and the children had great fun spotting them on a map of Knutsford. They worked like little detectives, hunting for clues and discovering how symbols help us to understand and navigate a map. It's been a fantastic week of learning – we are so proud of how hard Year 2 are working and the brilliant enthusiasm they are bringing to every lesson!

Reception have been loving PE with Mr Webb! Most of the lesson is currently taken up with getting everybody changed in and out of PE kit but this is improving every week. During The session Mr Webb is developing fundamental skills like, running, stopping, skipping, throwing and catching. The children are learning to control their body movements which provides a strong foundation for sport in later years.





This week, Year 6 have been exploring the life and work of the famous British artist, L.S. Lowry. Known for his unique paintings of industrial landscapes and 'matchstick people', Lowry's style captured scenes of everyday life in the North of England.

The children studied his distinctive use of line, colour and perspective before creating their own double-page spreads in sketchbooks to showcase what they had learnt. Their pages included information about the artist, examples of his most well-known works, and creative responses inspired by his style.

It was wonderful to see the pupils engage so thoughtfully with Lowry's art and take pride in presenting their learning so creatively.



This week in Maths, we have been busy adding ones, tens and hundreds to three-digit numbers. To help us, we used lots of manipulatives and resources such as place value counters, base ten and number cards. The children loved exploring different ways to solve problems – and as Thomas put it, “*we were in a resourceful mess!*” It was wonderful to see so much fun, teamwork and hands-on learning happening in the classroom.



This week, Year 4 had a wonderful time visiting the Methodist Church to learn all about Harvest. The children explored the theme through the harvests of the grain, earth, sea, soil, and flock. Volunteers from the church spoke to the children about the importance of Harvest and how it connects us to the world around us. The children took part in a range of engaging activities, including making paper boats to represent the sea, crafting clay pots for the earth, weaving using natural materials, tasting bread to celebrate the grain, and planting bulbs while thinking about the soil and future growth. Year 4 would like to say a big thank you to everyone involved in making the visit so special. The children thoroughly enjoyed the experience and showed the 5Rs brilliantly throughout their time at the church.
