This week we have been reading the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have looked at the different types of bridges found around the world and thought about what they had to be: stable, sturdy and reliable. With this in mind, we used materials in our classroom to build a bridge over the imaginary water. We then tested it as you can see. It reminded Mrs Taylor Wattam of somewhere she visited when she was younger, the Pontcysyllte Aquaduct, so we looked at that on the big screen.

We had a fantastic Career Afternoon for Year 5 and 6, with ten parents kindly volunteering their time to talk to the children about their careers. The children asked thoughtful questions and were inspired by the variety of opportunities available to them in the future. It was an engaging afternoon that helped broaden pupils' understanding of the world of work. A huge thank you to all the parents who helped make the event such a success!
