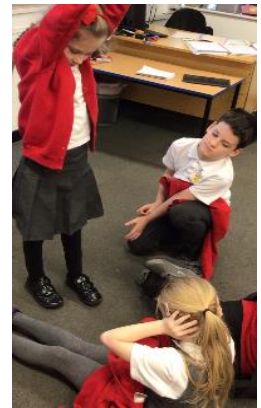
This week in Reception, we continued our work on hibernation and used natural materials to create hibernation dens for the wild creatures who live on our field. The children initially looked at a real nest to see how birds use natural materials to create something comfortable. We used sticks, leaves and moss to create safe, sturdy and warm dens.



This week in Geography, Year 2 have been learning how to identify a village, town and city. We began with team activities where the class sorted different features into city, countryside, or both, building brilliant discussion and teamwork skills. The children then completed independent work to consolidate their knowledge, showing great understanding. They also enjoyed sharing interesting facts about places they have visited and describing what those places were like. To finish, we played fun quiz games using our best geography detective skills to study photos, spot key features, and use clues to decide whether the location was a village, town or city. The children were so engaged and enthusiastic throughout—well done, Year 2!



The Year 3 and Year 4 mixed football tournament was a fantastic display of pride, courage and heart. Every player gave their all, representing our school with outstanding teamwork, sportsmanship and determination. They played incredibly well and should be very proud of their efforts. Year 3 had a fantastic time at our One Creative Sleep Workshop! The children learned all about the importance of sleep, the different stages our bodies move through each night, and helpful tips for getting good-quality rest. They were fully engaged throughout the session and especially enjoyed the calming mindfulness and meditation activities at the end. It was a wonderful, relaxing experience that left everyone feeling refreshed and informed.



This week in Nursery, the children have enjoyed exploring and learning about the Arctic and Antarctic and have created some wonderful cold weather animals for our display, please come and look when you are next in the playroom, it looks wonderful. During their learning they have enjoyed playing with the cold-water animals in the snow (made by our fabulous staff) and rescuing them from the ice with ice hammers. During maths we went on a number hunt on the big school field to find items which represented the number 2. It's been busy week, which they have all enjoyed!
