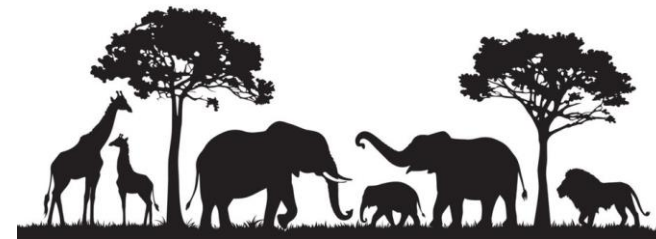


# KENYA



In Year 1 PSHE, children will learn about citizenship and what it means to belong to a class and school community. They will explore why rules are important and how they help everyone feel safe and ready to learn. They will learn about the needs of pets, babies, and young children, and how these needs change as they grow. Children will also explore similarities and differences between people and the groups they belong to.

They will be introduced to voting as a fair way to make decisions and begin to understand fairness, responsibility, and belonging.

In Maths, Year 1 will be covering:

- Numbers to 40
- Addition and Subtraction Word Problems
- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions

This half term, Year 1 will be exploring *Somebody Swallowed Stanley* by Sarah Roberts as their class text and focus for writing. This engaging story about the ocean and caring for our planet will inspire the children's ideas and enthusiasm for writing. Throughout the unit, the children will develop key Year 1 writing skills, including joining words and ideas using *and*, and using capital letters and full stops correctly. They will also begin to use question marks and exclamation marks, and learn how to add simple suffixes such as *-ed*, *-ing*, *-er*, and *-est* where the root word does not change. The children will practise writing clear, well-structured sentences and organising their ideas with increasing confidence.

This term in Science, Year 1 will continue their learning about carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores, developing their understanding of what different animals eat. They will also identify, name, and label the basic parts of the human body, linking each part to the correct sense: sight, hearing, smell, taste, and touch. Year 1 will build their scientific vocabulary and deepen their understanding of how animals, including humans, grow, survive, and stay healthy. By the end of the unit, the children will be able to confidently classify animals into groups, describe their features, and explain how humans are similar to and different from other animals.



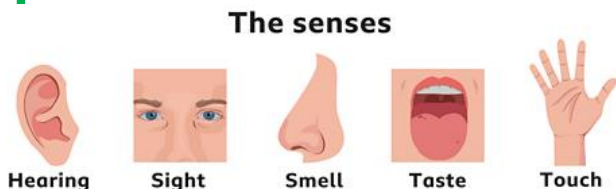
**Music: African Instruments**

The children will explore some key questions including: What does Njoro have in common with our town? What is the climate like in Kenya?
