Rhonics and Reading

- Your child will have a reading record book so you can record how they are getting on at home. Please comment or sign in the book every time your child reads.
- We use Little Wandle for Letters and Sounds as our phonics programme.
- Children take part in whole class phonics sessions daily. They will learn the sound that the letter makes and then use this to begin to read words.
- Reading is also taught through group reading practise sessions. Children will read the same book three times with an adult during the week. Each session has a different focus 1. Decoding 2. Prosody 3. Comprehension. Children will bring home that week's book on a Friday. The focus of re-reading this book at home is to develop fluency and comprehension. Please read this book with your child 4 times over the week and record in the child's reading record when they have read.
- Children will bring home 2 books a week to share at home. One will be a phonics book that they have read already at school and are familiar with. The other is a reading for pleasure book that they have chosen from the school library. Children are not expected to be able to read this themselves but it is for an adult to read to them sharing the enjoyment of reading.

EYFS-The Early Years Foundation Stage

- This is the curriculum that follow children from birth to 5 years old. It is
 the same curriculum children will have been following at Nursery and Preschool.
- The Reception year is the last year of EYFS. The National Curriculum begins in Year 1.
- This year children will work towards the Early Learning Goals which are
 the expected standards set out by the Government in the EYFS. We have
 included a copy of these for you to access on the school website.
- Children will learn through a mix of Adult Directed activities; where we set a task and work with the child to complete it, and child initiated activities, where the children choose activities to complete in the environment.
- When children are not learning specifically with an adult in a whole class or small group basis they are taking part in Discovery Time; learning through play both inside and outside the classroom.

EYFS Areas of Learning

These prime areas are essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development

4 Specific Areas

As a parent you can comment on observations that teaching staff have uploaded.

You can also add your own observations of things your child has done at home. Maybe they have learnt to ride their bike without stabilisers or can write their name by themselves. We really appreciate observations from home as they can support us

in collecting evidence toward the Early Learning Goals.

Behaviour

In class we have 5 values that underpin successful learning attitudes:

- Tidy up
- Kind hands and feet
- Stop, look and listen
- Share and care
- Join in
- •We use positive behaviour management strategies including praise, dojo points, stickers and certificates.
- •If there are any concerns over a child's behaviour teaching staff will speak to parents at the end of the day in person or in some circumstances by telephone.

How can I help my child?

Young children can be affected by changes in routine be they big or small. Please keep us informed so we can support your child in an appropriate way.

Part of our role is keeping your child safe and that includes ensuring they go home with the correct person. If you child is going to be collected by someone different to who normally collects please let us know. If this is a last minute change you can call the school office and they will pass on the message.

You can use Tapestry to share any achievements your child has out of school. These can they be celebrated with the whole class.

Lunch and Snack

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a free school lunch.

If you are in receipt of any government benefits please let the office know as it allows the school to access additional funding for your child.

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a healthy snack daily eg. a piece of fruit or vegetable.

As we are part of the healthy schools program can you ensure that if your child brings their own snack to school it is healthy - no crisps or chocolate please.

To support this all children should bring a drinks bottle to school every day filled with water not juice.

How well is my child doing?

- If you wish to discuss anything with the teachers we are available at the end of the school day on the playground. We can also arrange telephone or face to face meetings if need be.
- Tapestry will show you regular updates on your child's learning.
- The Reading Record Book will provide information about how you child is progressing with their reading.
- We have 2 parent's evenings during the year. One in October where
 we will discuss how your child has settled in to school and one in
 February where we will discuss the progress they have made and
 next steps for achieving the Early Learning Goals.
- In July you will receive a written report where we comment on your child's learning against the Early Learning Goals. This is an opportunity to celebrate all of the many things your child will achieve in their first year of school.
