ENGLISH

Coming to England

The children will begin to group related ideas into paragraphs; build a varied and rich vocabulary base and use prepositions to express time, place and cause.

MATHS

Throughout Autumn 1, we will explore place value and addition and subtraction building on their knowledge from KS1.

SCIENCE

Animals including Humans

The children will explore the importance of nutrition, identify the roles of skeletons and muscles, and learn how humans and animals move and grow. Furthermore, the pupils will investigate how different animals meet their dietary needs and how body structures support function and movement.


Amazing Rivers




Ancient Egypt




Humanism
