Art and DT

During this half term, children will be exploring a wide range of materials and looking at how textures can be created in different ways. Our project will link directly to our Science as children will be using a variety of materials to create a collage of a house using appropriate equipment.

<u>Science</u>

- Orally comment on observations about what they see and draw simple features
- Make observations during school ground fieldwork and record data in a block graph
- Draw a basic map representing my route to school
