Where is Cleethorpes?

Cleethorpes is a seaside town on the east coast of England.

Cleethorpes is on the banks of the Humber Estuary, a major river.

What is Cleethorpes like?

Cleethorpes is a large town with many inhabitants.

Nearly 40,000 people live in Cleethorpes.



What is a human feature?

A human feature is something that has been built by humans.

What is a physical feature?

A physical feature is a feature which is not made by a human; it is naturally on the Earth – like a river.



Where are features located?

Many houses are located near schools and local parks.

Shops are often close to a busy road so people can get to them easily.

Symbols on a plan or map can represent human and physical features.
