Understanding the World

Children will develop their understanding of plants, their parts and how they grow. They will learn that some foods are healthy/unhealthy and be able to sort these. They will be able to name a range of fruits and vegetables.

Children will enjoy exploring scientific concepts such as freezing and melting.

Physical Development

Children will continue to handle a range of tools and objects safely and with control during their play.

In PE, children will focus on movement and how to make different shapes with their bodies.

Communication and Language

Children will develop a great understanding of our topic books and be able to describe them with detail.

Children will be encouraged to ask questions to further their learning and to gain a deeper understanding of their environment.

They will talk confidently about why things happen and use new vocabulary in context.



Maths

Children will develop a deep understanding of numbers 6-10, learning how they can be sorted and composed. They will use this knowledge to help them combine two different groups.

They will also learn about height and length, beginning to measure with increasing accuracy and using the relevant vocabulary. We will look at a range of 3D shapes and create patterns.

PSED

Children will continue to develop an understanding of their feelings. They will learn that everybody needs help sometimes and will identify ways of being helpful to others, and the impact this has on their feelings.

Children will learn about how their own behaviour impacts others.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will be encouraged to create props to support their play, ensuring they think carefully about the best resources for the task and critiquing their designs to improve further. Every child will have the opportunity to create their own Supertato character.

Literacy

Children will take part in daily phonics sessions where they will read, write and continue learning phase 3 phonics sounds. Children will be encouraged to write simple sentences with increasing independence.

We will look at a number of Supertato stories. Children will be encouraged to make predictions and retell the story with accuracy.
