

Understanding the World

Children will learn that treasure can be their family, something they love or a memory. They will use discussion to compare their ideas of treasure or what is special to them.

Children will know that the temperature is high in summer, and it feels hot. Children will also learn about seasonal changes and look for signs of summer in the local environment.

The children will also know that plants have the following parts: roots, seedling, stem, leaves and flower. Plants need water and sunlight to help them to grow. Fruit and vegetables grow in the ground, on plants and in trees.

Physical Development

Children will now take part in weekly PE lessons. The focus of these terms PE will be object control. This includes throwing and catching with a variety of equipment and moving objects in a range of ways.

The children will have the opportunity to visit Twist and Flip this term, where they will use gymnastics equipment and develop their gross motor skills.

Maths

Children will continue their learning in maths through short session with a focus on numbers beyond 10. They will also explore adding more and taking away from a given amount.

The children will also learn about manipulating shapes to make pictures.

Communication and Language

Children will continue to develop their oracy skills through meaningful interactions with their peers. This includes using talk tokens which allows everyone the opportunity to participate in conversations. The children will focus these practises on our topics.

Reminder

Children will continue to take home a weekly reading book and homework. It is vital that the children read as much as possible to develop their fluency in reading. Keep practising with them daily if possible and using their blue books to support sound and High Frequency Word recognition.

PSED

Children will discuss things that are special to them and compare them with treasure. The children will also learn about safety rules for the beach discussing the things they should and shouldn't do while visiting the beach including Cleethorpes beach.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will be given lots of opportunities to create in the classroom while they use our craft area. The children will focus on creating items such as eye patches and pirate hooks as they explore this new topic. This will include taking on inspiration from fairytale stories to create castles, magic wands and more.

Children will have access to using musical instruments in the provision and will also take part in music lessons where they will explore rhythms and beats.

Literacy

Children will continue to take part in daily Monster Phonics lessons where they will start to read 4 letter words and build their ability to blend and segment them. Children will take part in Drawing Club where they will be exposed to a range of new vocabulary and different books and then create their own adventures in relation to the books each week. We will read Pirates Love Underpants and What the Ladybird Heard at the
