
Lets Challenge Nursery to Nursery Rhymes

Nursery children are being challenged to learn 8 nursery rhymes this half term. The children will be introduced to a nursery rhymes each week at school and then the nursery rhyme will be sent home to keep and practise at home. Once your child has learnt a nursery rhyme we will write their name on the board. Children will be awarded with a certificate if they complete the 8 part Nursery Rhyme challenge. Why are nursery rhymes 50 important?

Songs and rhymes have a hugely positive effect on a child's language and literacy development. Singing is exciting! Children love rhyme, repetition and rhythm. A child's attention is grabbed instantaneously! Rhyme tunes children's ears into all the sounds in a word. When singing rhymes they tend to be sung more slowly and clearly. This is great because it means that children have a chance to catch the words and the way they are formed. Children love to imitate so singing rhymes on a regular basis encourages speech. A child who knows four nursery rhymes by the time they are four will naturally be a better reader by the age of eight years old.
